FRUITS: Tokyo Street Style is a travelling exhibition from the Powerhouse Museum. Pink hair, kimonos and platform shoes – students can discover fantastic fashion from the streets of Tokyo through a series of colourful photographs and engage with a Japanese fashion subculture that has inspired fashion designers worldwide. This exhibition is a great opportunity for students studying visual arts – SOSE – textile design and LOTE – Japanese Language Studies.
